## PLANNING TIPS



### Look into your options early

KU students can study abroad as early as the second semester of their first year. It's never too early to start planning for study abroad!



### Summer Options

Summer is a great time to take Journalism elective courses abroad, or you can participate in an international internship opportunity to gain valuable work experience.



### Semester Study

As a Journalism student, you have a lot of flexibility when it comes to selecting courses to take abroad. You can take Journalism Core, Journalism elective, or KU core courses. You can also satisfy requirements for your major or minor outside of Journalism. You could study abroad during your second or third year, AND stay on track for graduation in four years.



### Talk with your academic advisor

Create a plan for study abroad during fall and/or spring advising in your first year at KU, or as early as possible.

## JOURNALISM COURSES

### AMERICAN UNIVERSITY IN BULGARIA

*Blagoevgrad, Bulgaria*

Located an hour from the capital city of Bulgaria, AUBG offers core JOUR courses such as Media Writing and Visual Storytelling as well as a variety of elective JOUR courses, all taught in English.

Eligibility: Sophomore standing with a GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

### DIS

*Copenhagen, Denmark*

Study in Denmark's beautiful capital and live with a Danish host family. Choose from a wide variety of courses taught in English including journalism courses such as International Strategic Communication and Social Media Strategic Communication. Most DIS courses have field study events during the semester to add depth and perspective as well as provide hands-on learning opportunities.

Eligibility: Junior standing. GPA of 3.0 is preferred.

Terms Offered: Fall, Spring, and Summer

### LORENZO DE MEDICI

*Florence, Italy*

Lorenzo de Medici is one of the most distinctive and well-established study abroad institutions in Europe offering over 500 different courses in English in 38 subject areas. This is a great option to satisfy JOUR elective hours or complete your Journalism Ethics requirement.

Eligibility: Sophomore status with a GPA of 2.8 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall, Spring, and Summer

### MASSEY UNIVERSITY

*Wellington, New Zealand*

Set on the edge of a spectacular harbor, the Wellington campus offers students a variety of courses in creative arts, design, business, and communications. Multimedia Editing and Diversity in the Media are among the journalism offerings available.

Eligibility: Sophomore status with a GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall, Spring. Note: many of the approved journalism courses are offered during KU's spring semester.

### UNIVERSITY OF STIRLING

*Stirling, Scotland*

While Stirling itself is an ancient fortress town dominated by its famous castle and ancient residence of Scotland's kings, the University of Stirling's campus is regarded as one of the most modern campuses in the UK. In addition to journalism course offerings such as Journalism Ethics and Media Writing, Stirling also has a reputation as a superior UK institution for Management and Business studies, Film and Media, and Environmental Studies.

Eligibility: Preferred junior status and a GPA of 2.8 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall, Spring, and Summer

### SWANSEA UNIVERSITY

*Swansea, Wales*

Swansea University is situated on the south Wales coastline and is less than three hours by train from London and less than an hour away from Cardiff, the capital of Wales. This is a good option to satisfy elective hours for journalism. Courses are also offered in the humanities, social sciences, business, and more.

Eligibility: Preferred junior status and a GPA of 2.8 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

### UNIVERSITY OF WOLLONGONG

*Wollongong, Australia*

The city of Wollongong is a vibrant, bustling, multicultural city 50 miles to the south of Sydney. The university has a wide range of courses available from a multitude of academic areas, and approved journalism courses include Infomania, Digital Media, Magazine Journalism, and Ethics.

Eligibility: Second semester sophomore and a cumulative GPA of 2.7 or higher.

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

## COURSES TAUGHT IN SPANISH

### PONTIFICIA UNIVERSIDAD CATOLICA ARGENTINA

*Buenos Aires, Argentina*

UCA is a private university with an ultra modern campus that is set in a lively neighborhood filled with theatres, restaurants, and museums. Take courses in Spanish in academic disciplines such as business, journalism, or Latin American Studies.

Eligibility: Students must have completed at least four semesters of college and have completed at least four semesters or the equivalent of Spanish prior to studying abroad (SPAN 216). Minimum GPA 2.75.

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

### UNIVERSIDAD DE COSTA RICA

*San Jose, Costa Rica*

The Universidad de Costa Rica (UCR), one of the top research universities in Central America, offers a wide variety of courses taught in Spanish and includes an on-site orientation giving students a well-structured introduction to the country and its culture and history. Past Journalism students have selected UCR to help satisfy their second major or minor course requirements as well as improve their Spanish language skills.

Eligibility: Sophomore standing and a minimum GPA of 3.0 with at least 4 semesters of college-level Spanish (or equivalent).

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

## EXPERIENTIAL OPPORTUNITIES

### SIT MOROCCO: FIELD STUDIES IN JOURNALISM AND NEW MEDIA

*Rabat, Morocco*

This 15-week-long program consists of Journalism coursework in English as well as language study in French or Arabic. You will spend the majority of the semester finding, researching, and executing a story topic of your choosing under the expert guidance of journalists from Round Earth Media. Your feature may ultimately be considered for publication (in print, broadcast, or online) in US news outlets with which Round Earth Media works.

Eligibility: Previous college-level coursework in writing, journalism, communications, and/or media studies, or other related fields. Strong writing skills and an interest in journalism are essential. A writing sample may be required as part of the admissions process.

Terms Offered: Fall and Spring

### INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIPS

*Various Locations*

Internship placements and duties vary based on location and student interest. Internship opportunities are a great way to develop your personal, professional, and intercultural competencies; gain insight into the working culture of your host country; apply classroom knowledge to real-life scenarios; and build your resume.

Eligibility: Preference for Juniors and Seniors, some locations are available to sophomores, cumulative GPA of 2.75.

Terms Offered: Summer

## FACULTY-LED SUMMER PROGRAMS (OFFERED ON A ROTATIONAL BASIS)

### SCOTTISH MEDIA & CULTURE: INTL. STRAT. COMM.

*Stirling, Scotland*

Students will be immersed in the digital information process, creating a multimedia information package suitable for online delivery. Students in the news/information track will register for JOUR 550, and students in the strategic communication track will register for JOUR 560. Students also have the option of adding an additional one or two University of Stirling courses at the conclusion of the faculty-led program.

Eligibility: Nine hours of journalism or instructor permission.

### CREATIVITY & CULTURE: ROME

*Rome, Italy*

Students will work in collaborative teams to conduct ethnographic research with an emphasis on trends and cultural consumer styles. In addition to structured, ethnographic exploration, the 3-week session includes a series of group intensive creative workshops where teams will produce one special edition of The Agency's new culture and trends quarterly publication called "The Watch." This special edition will include developing promotional messaging.

Eligibility: Eight hours of journalism or instructor permission.

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
